

### INTERNATIONAL RACE DRIVERS CLUB (IRDC) EVENT SUPPLEMENTAL REGULATIONS 2011

- ALL PEOPLE ENTERING PACIFIC RACEWAYS (PR) MUST SIGNA WAIVER AND WEAR A WRISTBAND ON THEIR WRIST AT ALL TIMES. NO EXCEPTIONS.
- 2. Entrance to PR on the Friday of a race weekend shall only be allowed after 4:00pm on Friday. Early Friday arrivals (i.e. before 4:00 pm Friday) shall line up until gates open at 4:00pm. Exception being if you are a participant or volunteer worker for Friday Test & Tune.
- 3. There will be no starting of any race engines prior to 9:00 am.
- 4. ICSCC NOISE RULE 1112 enforced! 103db @ 50 ft. No exceptions.
- 5. The "5-Minute Warning" will be given 9 minutes prior to the start of the race to accommodate the 4-minute pace lap.
- 6. If you use the escape road at 3A you will be held at the stop sign for a minimum of 10 seconds prior to re-entry under the direction of the worker at turn station 4.
- 7. Open to cars eligible under ICSCC and SCCA current regulations.
- 8. No class changes after 1:00 pm on Saturday.
- 9. Drivers are responsible for properly and completely filling out their entry registration form(s).
- 10. Multiple Entries: A driver entering the same car in more than one event shall indicate on each entry form whether the entry is for the driver's "primary" or "additional" event. If the entries are oversubscribed for a particular event (entries exceed the number of cars allowed on the track) drivers and cars entered as an "additional" event will be restricted from participating on a first come, first served priority based on the date the entries are received. This will allow participation by all drivers and cars for whom the event is their primary event including novices upgrading to a championship event on that weekend.
- 11. Consumption of alcoholic beverages is <u>NOT</u> allowed at any time during the racing event, except in the area covered by the liquor permit issued by the Washington State Liquor Control Board. The time and location is a condition of operation of the track and enforced by track officials, ICSCC, IRDC officials or law enforcement.
- 12. All Entrants shall present at tech inspection empty, sealable, container(s) marked with driver's name and car number, capable of holding 2 gallons of liquids. These are to be used to remove all oil, cleaners, brake fluid, etc. from PR. Anyone caught dumping oil at the raceway will be fined and banned from Pacific Raceways. There will be a \$10.00 per tire charge imposed by the track for the disposal of tires.
- 13. Damage to the track, grounds or buildings, regardless of cause, will be charged to the driver responsible. Any damage to any equipment or devices utilized by the sanctioning body (ICSCC) or sponsoring club (IRDC) to conduct this race, regardless of cause, will be charged to the driver responsible.
- 14. A Minor Release form is required for all minors upon entry to the track. Minors must be under direct supervision of an adult at all times. No minors under 18 years of age are allowed in the hot pits or pre-grid. Operation of any type of wheeled transportation (bikes, scooters, motorcycles, skateboards, skates, etc.) is forbidden for anyone under the age of 16 years.
- 15. A speed limit of 5 mph will be enforced in the paddock.
- 16. No overnight camping at the track on Sunday night without the consent of PR management.
- 17. There will be no refueling in the grid area unless accompanied by a fire extinguisher and operator.
- 18. No motorized tow or support vehicles allowed on pre-grid unless authorized by the Grid Marshall or Race Chairman. Support vehicles behind pre-grid must be parked along the fence
- 19. No open fires are allowed in the paddock, pre-grid or within the track in-field.
- 20. All gates are locked at 11:00 pm Friday and Saturday nights. The main gate will open by 7:00 am.
- 21. Only one support vehicle or trailer is allowed in the pits per competition car.
- 22. The length of scheduled events may be altered by the Race Chairman due to emergency conditions beyond the control of IRDC personnel.
- 23. IRDC reserves the right to refuse entry to this event to anyone.
- 24. No bicycles, scooters, or walking allowed on the access road adjacent to the main straight from the paddock to pre-grid. This is a PR rule.
- 25. Pets must be leashed at all times and owners are responsible for cleaning up animal waste.
- 26. All in-car timing system transmitter beacons must be placed in the gated area east of the walkway to the Turn 9 grandstands. Transmitters outside of the specified area will be confiscated by the Race Chairman.
- 27. Turn 1 / Pit Out blend line violators will be dealt with by the Race Steward.
- 28. All request for split or staggered starts must be made to the Race Stewart before the end of the events on the day prior to the race.

### Steward's Soapbox

Someone mentioned to me that I ought to reiterate to everyone what my interpretation of what point does the driver in front of you owe you racing room when you are attempting a pass.

This question can be distilled down to "presentation". I will continue to interpret this much as Hal Hilton stated a few years ago, with a little twist. Paraphrasing him a bit (sorry Hal if I get this off a bit), if your wheel is up to the door of the car in front of you before the turn-in point, *CR 1504* kicks in, and the car in front of you owes you room and cannot turn down to the apex. Since I imagine most of you haven't memorized the Rulebook, *CR 1504* states, "**Responsibility in overtaking**. Under all conditions, both the passed and the passing car shall be equally responsible for the safe passing of one by the other."

This may be a little door-slammer specific, so I'm going to simplify this even more. I will be looking at the relationship of the car to the driver of the opposing car. If the front of the car attempting the pass reaches a line even with the driver in front before he or she turns-in, then the car in front owes racing room. My reasoning is there should be a reasonable expectation that the driver of the car in front sees the car attempting the pass to the side of him before he goes for the apex. This comes with a big "however" though. No Steward has ever been a fan of dive-bomb passes. The car attempting the pass must be under control, capable of making the corner cleanly, and not coming from multiple car-lengths behind. The attempt shouldn't be a big surprise to the car ahead. Passes that are attempted with the car out of control are Dangerous Driving and will be dealt with accordingly.

As CR 1504 states, once your car reaches the point that it's properly presented, it is now the responsibility of both drivers to avoid contact. If it's an inside move, the car in front can't turn down on you, but you also can't "run him up" to the outside of the corner either. Both cars now owe each other a car-width plus a little bit to the edge of the track. The same can be said of a pass that occurs on a straight. If the front of the car is even with the driver, both cars now owe each other room.

So when does the guy in front of you NOT owe you racing room? Again, it goes back to "presentation". If your car is not properly presented, you should not expect the driver in front of you to give you anything. No matter how close you are (or how much faster your car may be than theirs), if the person in front of you is a good racer, they most likely WILL turn for the apex, and you should expect them to do so.

All of this being said, I realize that every situation will have nuances that need to be taken into consideration. I'm sure all of you can come up with an "Oh yeah, but what about this?" question. That's what makes the Steward's job so fun! I promise we will consider all of that if need be, but use what I've discussed here as your guide when you're making decisions out there in the heat of it.

  - 3.1 Completed entry form(s). 3.2 Prepaid in full. 3.3 No license issues. 3.4 Vehicle has a transponder and does not require a rental. 3.5 Have an acceptable Annual Tech inspection noted in their vehicle log book. 3.6 Not included in the mandatory Tech group for the weekend. 3.7 Express Tech drivers should bring their personal safety gear and vehicle log book to Registration, where gear will be inspected and a weekend tech sticker issued. 3.8 Express Tech eligibility is determined by the Registrar.
- 4. Family and Crew members with questions are to contact Driver Services at ORP Administration Building.
- 5. Due to extreme fire danger, smoking is permitted only on paved or gravel areas. Please extinguish and remove smokeables carefully and completely.
- 6. Event announcements will be made over an FM radio broadcast and/or PA system. Please be prepared.
- 7. This event is organized under 2011 ICSCC Competition Regulations and all who enter ORP are subject to them. Team Continental reserves the right to refuse entry to this event or to ORP at any time.
- 8. Participants under 18 years old are not allowed in hot pits or on victory laps. Children under 12 must have direct adult supervision at all times.
- 9. A current and properly completed minor release form, signed by an authorized adult, must be on record for all minor participants at ORP.
- 10. Competition numbers must comply with Section 1106 and will be strictly enforced.
- 11. No skateboards or scooters allowed in the paddock area. Users of bicycles and small motorized vehicles may have riding privileges revoked at any time.
- 12. Refueling not allowed in Pregrid. Fueling in the hot pits requires a crew member assigned only to operate a fire bottle. Excess spillage will result in a penalty.
- 13. Pit and Pregrid roads must remain clear.
