TC Supplemental Regulations 2012

- Move in to the paddock at ORP will be available upon completion of Registration. The process of moving in/out of the paddock may take extra time. Please be patient and courteous - Thank You In Advance For Your Support!
- 2. Registration & Express Tech will be held at ORP Administration Building near Pregrid;
- 3. Express Tech is available at Registration for those drivers who meet the following: 3.1 Completed entry form(s). 3.2 Prepaid in full. 3.3 No license issues. 3.4 Vehicle has a transponder and does not require a rental. 3.5 Have an acceptable Annual Tech inspection noted in their vehicle log book. 3.6 Not included in the mandatory Tech group for the weekend. 3.7 Express Tech drivers should bring their personal safety gear and vehicle log book to Registration, where gear will be inspected and a weekend tech sticker issued. 3.8 Express Tech eligibility is determined by the Registrar.
- 4. Family and Crew members with questions are to contact Driver Services at ORP Administration Building.
- Due to extreme fire danger, smoking is permitted only on paved or gravel areas. Please extinguish and remove smokeables carefully and completely.
- 6. Event announcements will be made over an FM radio broadcast and/or PA system. Please be prepared.
- This event is organized under 2012 ICSCC Competition Regulations and all who enter ORP are subject to them.
 Team Continental reserves the right to refuse entry to this event or to ORP at any time.
- Participants under 18 years old are not allowed in hot pits or on victory laps. Children under 12 must have direct adult supervision at all times.
- A current and properly completed minor release form, signed by an authorized adult, must be on record for all minor participants at ORP.
- 10. Competition numbers must comply with Section 1106 and will be strictly enforced.
- No skateboards or scooters allowed in the paddock area. Users of bicycles and small motorized vehicles may have riding privileges revoked at any time.
- Refueling not allowed in Pregrid. Fueling in the hot pits requires a crew member assigned only to operate a fire bottle.
 Excess spillage will result in a penalty.
- 13. Pit and Pregrid roads must remain clear.
- 14. Noise rule ICSCC 1112 enforced. 103 db at 50 ft.
- 15. Safety Belt rule ICSCC 1105B enforced.
- 16. Damage to ORP grounds, equipment or structures regardless of cause, will be charged to the driver responsible. Also, damage to any equipment or devices used by the sanctioning body (ICSCC) or sponsoring club (TC) to conduct this race, regardless of cause, will be charged to the driver responsible.
- 17. All entrants for this event shall present at tech inspection an empty, sealable container marked with the driver's name and license number, capable of holding 2 gallons of liquid. These are to be used to remove all oil, cleaners, brake fluid, etc. from ORP. There will be no drums provided.
- 18. If entries exceed the number of cars allowed on the track for a particular event, drivers and cars entered as an additional entry will be restricted from participating based on the date entries were received. This is in order to allow participation by all drivers for whom the event is their primary event, including Novices upgrading to a championship event.
- 19. NSF checks will be charged an additional \$50 fee.
- Staggered start and split start requests shall be submitted to the Race Steward no later than the end of on-track activity on the day previous to the race.
- 21. Potable water, electricity and cell phone service may be limited or non-existent.
- Pets must be leashed at all times and owners are responsible for cleaning up waste.
- 23. All in-car timing system transmitter beacons will be placed at a location designated by the Race Chairman.
- Turn one (1) Pit-out blend line violations will be dealt with by the Race Steward.
- 25. The 5-minute warning may be given earlier than 5 minutes before the scheduled session start.
- 26. All race vehicles towed from the track may be dropped off at impound
- 27. USE EXTREME CAUTION exiting Pregrid onto course VEHICLES MAY BE APPROACHING FROM HOT PITS!
- 28. USE EXTREME CAUTION exiting course at Turn# 12 SAFETY VEHICLES MAY BE ENTERING HOT PITS!
- Additional supplemental regulations may be included in your registration packet...Please be prepared.

Steward's Soapbox



Hello ICSCC Racers, Marshals and supporters,

Today is June 19, and we have 5 of our 15 scheduled races in the books - fully 1/3 of the way through the 2012 season. For me, this first part of the season has gone extremely quickly. I am also very happy to say that it has gone pretty well, too, in

terms of the quality of driving and sportsmanship I have observed. The larger run groups and classes tend to be the places we encounter the most challenges because of the level of competition, and the sheer numbers of cars on the track at the same time. But really, we have had very few problems (he says, knocking on the wood of the old desk). Most everyone seems to have a good balance between their levels of competitiveness and their ability to drive within their limits.

In case you are not sure who your Stewarding team are for 2012, besides me, there are 3 other people who are giving a lot of their time and energy to help make sure we have safe and fair championships this year. Terry Overdiek is the Assistant Steward and will follow me as the Race Steward for the 2013 season. Terry has shown very clearly that he is a knowledgeable, thoughtful and calm official who can investigate and objectively assess a situation and make good calls under pressure. Working well with racers, marshals and other ICSCC and club officials is key to success as a Steward, and Terry has done a great job across the board. I am very pleased to have the chance to work with Terry, and as the season progresses, you will see him taking more and more of a leadership role as he prepares for the Race Steward role in 2013.

We have two Technical Stewards this year, and after running incredibly hard and long last year whenever things got crazy, I am very thankful for their presence and their help. It is especially nice to have both of them there to help when things have gotten busy, like on the first weekend in Portland, and when we had the rain and the serious accident at Seattle. Scott Morton and Duane

Martinsen have consistently stepped up to whatever duties have needed to be done while also maintaining their competitive driving efforts. Both have a very strong grasp of the technical aspects of Conference racing, and have proven themselves able to make good calls under pressure also. You will find them each very happy to help you understand technical and other rules questions you may have.

The Steward development process that ICSCC has created over the last few years positions the incoming Race Steward to be knowledgeable, experienced and well qualified to handle the duties of the role. I cannot imagine stepping into this job without the guidance and education that Tom Olsson provided me when I was Assistant Steward last season! Now that I am in this role, it is also nice to know that I am not alone. ICSCC also provides for a support group of former Stewards in the form of the Steward Advisory Committee to help educate and guide the current Stewarding team. When faced with difficult situations, I have been able to rely on each of our three members of the committee for their input and support. The 2012 Steward Advisory Committee are Tom Olsson, Bill Spornitz and Hal Hilton, all highly respected former Race Stewards.

I am telling you all of this information about Stewards because I want you to know that this is a fascinating role that you may wish to consider for yourself in the future! I came into ICSCC and sports car racing in 1998, so I had a lot of experience as a racer before I decided to step up to this position and the two year commitment that it entails. I encourage those of you who have been around for several years to consider the idea of giving back to Conference by becoming a Steward. If you have an interest, please don't hesitate to reach out to any one of the current or former Stewards, who will be happy to share their experiences and thoughts about the role.

One of the interesting and challenging duties of the Steward is that of reviewing and making judgements about new and modified race tracks. Last year, Spokane County Raceway underwent a

championship race event that was held there in July. SCR and NWMS made those changes and when we arrived before the weekend, the Stewards were able to inspect the track to assure the changes had been made in a satisfactory manner.

This year, we are all anticipating the opportunity to run our first race at The Ridge Motorsports Park in Shelton, WA. I am very excited about this track, as I believe it is a fun and challenging track, and that it will benefit motorsports in the Pacific Northwest. I believe that the "rising tide" of motorsports interest that is encouraged by a new track/venue will help all motorsports associated businesses, including the one that I am a founder and part owner of, Oregon Raceway Park. (I tell you about my relationship with ORP in the spirit of full disclosure.)

On Saturday, June 16, an inspection team led by me and made up of 7 ICSCC officials, all of whom are either current or former Race Stewards. reviewed The Ridge's road race course with the track owners. The team identified a list of several safety improvements that are required prior to ICSCC granting approval for Championship Race events to be held there. These requirements were communicated to The Ridge owners on Monday, June 18, and we expect to hear back from them on or before June 27, which is the day before we must make our decision to remove the "tentative" status on our calendar. These changes are each important for the safety of the track, from a driver and a marshal perspective. I am hopeful that The Ridge will find all of the changes to be reasonable and acceptable, and that they will agree to have

these changes in place prior to our race weekend in August. Having been through this both from the track and the ICSCC perspective myself, I can tell you that one of the key difference makers I have seen in helping ORP and SCR get over the hump with their required improvements has been volunteer support. I do not know if or how The Ridge or IRDC may ask for or need your help, but please be prepared to rise to the call to go help build tire barriers or what ever else may be needed. You can make a difference!

I look forward to the middle of our racing season and my favorite part of the year. See you at the track!

- 2. Event is organized under 2012 ICSCC Competition Regulations, and all who enter The Ridge Motorsports Park are subject to them.
- ALL PEOPLE ENTERING THE RIDGE MOTORSPORTS PARK MUST SIGN A WAIVER AND WEAR A WRISTBAND ON THEIR WRIST AT ALL TIMES. NO EXCEPTIONS.
- 4. There will be no starting of any race engines prior to 8:00am.
- 5. ICSCC NOISE RULE 1112 enforced! 103db @ 50 ft. No exceptions.
- 6. The "5-Minute Warning" will be given 9 minutes prior to the start of the race to accommodate the four (4) minute pace lap.
- 7. Pit Lane speed limit is 35 mph.
- 8. A speed limit of 5 mph will be enforced in the paddock.
- 9. Pit Out blend line violators will be dealt with by the Race Steward.
- 10. Damage to the track, grounds or buildings, regardless of cause, will be charged to the driver responsible. Any damage to any equipment or devices utilized by the sanctioning body (ICSCC) or sponsoring club (IRDC) to conduct this race, regardless of cause, will be charged to the driver responsible.
- 11. Consumption of alcoholic beverages is <u>NOT</u> allowed at any time during the racing event, except in the area covered by the liquor permit issued by the Washington State Liquor Control Board. The time and location is a condition of operation of the track and enforced by track officials, ICSCC, IRDC officials or law enforcement.
- 12. All Entrants shall present at tech inspection empty, sealable, container(s) marked with driver's name and car number, capable of holding 2 gallons of liquids. These are to be used to remove all oil, cleaners, brake fluid, etc. from The Ridge Motorsports Park.
- 13. Minors (under 18 years of age) must be under direct supervision of an adult at all times. No minors under 18 years of age are allowed in the hot pits or pre-grid. Operation of any type of wheeled transportation (bikes, scooters, motorcycles, skateboards, skates, etc.) is forbidden for anyone under the age of 16 years.
- 14. There will be no refueling in the grid area unless accompanied by a fire extinguisher and operator and with permission of Grid Marshall official only.

SPECIAL RACE RULES:

- MANDATORY GTCC DRIVER'S MEETING will take place immediately following the regular Saturday driver's meeting. All GTCC drivers must be in attendance.
- 2. Regular ICSCC rules apply, except as noted specifically below.
- 3. Entry fee is per car.
- 4. One or two drivers per car.
- 5. Qualifying will consist of one out lap followed by a single timed green flag lap. Once shown the checkers you must retire to the paddock. No tire scrubbing permitted on the out lap. If a yellow flag condition should occur before you receive the checkers, you are permitted to return to the pit lane to rejoin at the end of the line of the remaining cars waiting to qualify. Qualifying order will be set based on practice times, fastest first. Fast qualifying time on pole. Either driver may qualify the car.
- 6. Pit lane speed limit is 35 mph.
- 7. There is a mandatory pit stop required between 25 and 35 minutes elapsed time. For single driver cars, the car must come to a complete stop with the engine shut off in the pit box before a 60 second hold begins. Once 60 seconds has elapsed, the car will be released by the timing official, however it is the driver's responsibility to leave the pit box safely in pit lane traffic. For two driver cars, the engine must be shut off before a driver exchange may take place. The car is permitted to leave the pit box as quickly as the driver exchange can be completed. There is no 60 second hold for two driver cars. Pit stops are allowed outside of the mandatory window, but do not count towards the mandatory stop. No one under 18 allowed in pit lane.
- 8. Fueling is permitted, no fuel towers, one dedicated crew person with fire bottle required. Crew members involved with actual fueling must be attired equal to or greater than driver. It is suggested that fire bottle crew person be attired equal to or greater than driver, but that is not a requirement. Driver exchange, assistant, windshield cleaning permitted while fueling. No other work permitted while fueling. No limit to number of crew, however each crew person must have a specific function.
- 9. Pit lane will close during Full Course Caution situations. If a FCC occurs during the mandatory pit stop window, the amount of time under FCC will be added to the end of the mandatory pit stop window. Pit lane will not re-open following a FCC until the entire field has taken the green on the restart.
- No work of any kind is permitted under Black or Red flag situations. The race clock will continue to run.
- 11. Any car returning to the paddock will be considered to have withdrawn from the race and will not be permitted to re-enter the circuit.
- Violation of any rule will result in a stop and go penalty assessed during green flag conditions, separate from any pit stop.

CSCC Supplemental Regulations 2012

Infractions will result in penalties assessed to the driver.

- Open to cars eligible under ICSCC current regulations.
- This event is organized under 2012 ICSCC Competition Regulations, and all who enter PIR are subject to them. Cascade Sports Car Club reserves the right to refuse entry to this event or to PIR at any time.
- Alcoholic beverages allowed in the beer garden area only, and only after the track closes. You may NOT bring alcohol into PIR!
 This is an Oregon Liquor Commission requirement. Any person caught entering PIR with alcohol will be removed from the raceway.
- Registration Hours: 6:00 pm-8:00 Friday, 7:30 am 1:30 pm Saturday and 7:30 am 10:30 am Sunday.
- 5. Express Tech is available at Registration for those drivers who have an acceptable, current Annual Tech inspection noted in their vehicle logbook, and the driver is not part of the mandatory Tech presentation group for the weekend. Express Tech drivers should bring their personal safety gear and vehicle logbook to Registration where your gear will be inspected and a weekend tech sticker issued.
- People under 18 years old are not allowed in hot pits, pre-grid or on victory laps. Children under 12 must have direct adult supervision at all times.
- A current and properly completed minor release form, signed by an authorized adult, must be on record for all minor participants brought into PIR.
- 8. Competition numbers must be readable: Section 1106 enforced.
- 9. The scales will be open Saturday from noon and Sunday all day.
- 10. No skateboards or scooters allowed in the paddock area. Users of bicycles and small-motorized vehicles may have riding privileges revoked at any time by the Race Chairperson.
- Refueling is not allowed in pre-grid. Fueling in the hot pits requires a crewmember assigned only to operate a fire bottle. Excess spillage will result in a penalty.
- 12. No smoking allowed in hot pits, pre-grid or any PIR building.
- 13. Only one support vehicle allowed in the paddock. Pit and pre-grid roads must remain clear.
- 14. Noise rule ICSCC 1112 enforced! 103 dB at 50 ft.: no exceptions!
- 15. Oregon State Law requires functioning mufflers to be used at PIR. Functioning mufflers must be capable of reducing sound energy by at least 5dB at trackside. Cars losing mufflers, even if they are still below the sound level, will be black-flagged immediately.
- 16. Damage to the track, grounds or buildings, regardless of cause, will be charged to the driver responsible. Also, damage to any equipment or devices used by the sanctioning body (ICSCC) or sponsoring club (CSCC) to conduct this race, regardless of cause, will be charged to the driver responsible.
- 17. Family and crewmembers of drivers are to contact the landline communication person at pre-grid with any questions regarding their driver or car while on track.
- 18. All entrants for this event shall present at tech inspection an empty, sealable container or containers, marked with the driver's name and license number, capable of holding 2 gallons of liquid. These are to be used to remove all oil, cleaners, brake fluid, etc. from PIR. There will be no drums provided.
- 19. Anyone caught dumping oil at the raceway will be fined and banned from the raceway. This is a PIR regulation.
- 20. If entries exceed the number of cars allowed on the track for a particular event, drivers and cars entered as an "additional event" will be restricted from participating, on a first-come, first-served priority based on the date entries were received. This is in order to allow participation by all drivers for whom the event is their primary event, including Novices upgrading to a championship event.
- 21. NSF checks will be charged an additional \$50 fee.
- 22. The racing "hot pit" is defined as that area under the control of Hot Pits personnel. This area is located immediately west of the break in the concrete wall half way up the pit lane. Per ICSCC rule #1607, any person over that "pit wall" during practice, qualifying or races shall wear long pants, shirts that cover the shoulders, and shall not be barefoot or wear open-toed shoes. At the one-minute warning, pre-grid becomes a "hot" area. At that time, pre-grid must be cleared of all crew, support personnel and spectators. Notwithstanding the above, ICSCC rule #1607 does not apply to the pre-grid area.
- 23. All cars that are towed into the paddock area are subject to being dropped off in impound. Drivers must wear all required drivers safety equipment (per ICSCC rule # 1105) before they are allowed to enter the track, while they are on the track, beyond positive protection, under flat tow, or in the hot pits area.
- 24. The 5-minute warning will be given approximately 8 minutes before the start of the race.
- 25. Due to recent incidents, extension cords from the pit exit to tech/scales must use a more secure method other than Duct Tape.
- 26. Staggered start and split start requests shall be submitted to the race steward no later than the end of on-track activity on the day previous to the race.
- 27. Blendline- the Red Blendline stays on drivers left as you enter the racetrack from the pit area. You are required to stay on the right side until the Red Blend line ends. This is <u>REQUIRED EVERY TIME you</u> enter the Race Track, other than the race out lap. The Red Blendline stays on the drivers left at the end of the Turn 12 tirewall. <u>If you are to exit the race track at anytime, you are required to stay completely to the right.</u> If you cross the blendline with ONE TIRE you are required to stay out for one more lap unless you are exiting the track after you have received the checkered flag and crossed the start/finish line.

License Director

As I learn more about the infrastructure we have in place to make races happen, the more I realize I don't know. Novice Race days are pretty busy, but if I'm not racing I have plenty of time on Sundays. Rather than loading up and getting on the road home early, I've been learning about the volunteer specialties and getting to know some of the fine folks involved.

Sunday afternoon at the Rose City Opener I spent time stuffed into the right seat of Jon Brobst's Viper pace car. Turns out there's more to pace car driving than is evident to us drivers. He's constantly on the lookout for track surface conditions – things that turn workers aren't able to see. Jon can from the driver's seat. Because it's fast, the pace car is used between sessions to shuttle people and items to and from turn stations. That's how the stewards get their hands on your pass-under-yellow turn report so

quickly! If Jon is closest to a disabled race car, he'll respond, push a disabled car to safety, put out a fire, and keep race control informed. In addition to all that, he gives orientation laps to new workers. Driving pace since 1993, he brings experience to the job gained from driving pace on the Viper Cup circuit as well as working Cascade and other events at PIR.

On Memorial Day at ORP, Safety II was my ride. What a ride! That day Safety II was an F-350 crew cab with slippery leather seats and a big solid "aw shucks" handle (this is a family publication...) for passenger stabilization. Rob Jacobsen, 40 year veteran of wearing white on weekends, was pilot in command. Fortunately not much went wrong that afternoon, but when it did, Rob was hard on the go pedal. Not because anyone was in danger, but because we had to get to an incident and get it cleaned up quickly so that drivers' race time wasn't impacted any more than necessary. Rob has taken Conference driver training and knows the

fast way around a race track – his lines are better than some of ours! I asked him what he has observed in drivers that he wishes were different. The answer is, by all means be careful around the truck and obey flags, but don't overslow when passing a rolling safety truck. Get by them so that they can get to where they need to be, quickly – they may be waiting for you to get by so they can

cross to the other side of the track. That and don't even think about racing through an incident response with worker boots on the ground. That will earn you a very bad reputation among those you may count on some day.

My quest for knowledge about behind the scenes procedures actually started in March of last year, when I was about to start this License Director gig. I knew I was going to have to talk on the radio and I wanted to know the protocol. I wanted to sit in race control during the Spring Enduro and

listen, but Dave Bell talked me into manning one of the race control frequencies. Dave talked to the turn stations, safety, pace car, the wrecker, the ambulance, sound control, and probably a few other functions I'm forgetting. All while keeping a running log of events on a laptop. I got the easier job of talking to the stewards, the race chair, timing, registration, driver services, and the front gate. What impressed me most was how Dave had a complete and accurate mental picture of what was happening on track at all times.

Common themes among all the specialties I've visited are how much there is to know, and the depth of knowledge and experience we have in our volunteers. I keep finding great people who know a lot, are willing to share it, and are fun to hang out with.
